- Have all materials and supplies ready

- Check your audio and video setting prior to starting.
- Use appropriate background setting.

#### Independent Work

- Stav focused on the task at hand.
- Schedule time for each assignment.
- Ask questions if you have them.
- Attempt to find the answer on your own.

#### Breakout Groups

- Be familiar with moving from General Session to Breakout Groups.
- Ask for help if you don't know how to move to your breakout room.

#### Communication(s)

- Speak with purpose have a reason to speak
- Use proper netiquette
- Dress appropriately

10th Grade: Jade C.


